### **Pre-conference Options**

### 12:30 p.m.-4:30 p.m., Thursday, June 7

Pre-conference activities will include a choice of three garden tours OR a two-part workshop. Separate registration and fees are required, and reservations are limited. Tours and workshops will be held rain or shine. Pre-conference tours and workshop cost \$40 each.

**Note:** Many of the gardens require walking on uneven grass, gravel and narrow brick/stone pathways.

### Country Garden Tour #1

- Woody Warehouse in Lizton is a nursery specializing in native trees and shrubs. Observe seeds through propagation with various root pruning techniques. Visit the propagation greenhouse.
- Landscaper John Chapin met the challenge when a grove of 30 trees needed to be removed, resulting in dozens of shade perennial transplants. John is a collector of unique and beautiful plants.



 When Steve and Kim Somermeyer built their Hendricks County home, grape vines were the first plantings. Steve serves as a judge for wine competitions. They will discuss the challenges of Indiana grape growing and provide a winetasting experience, too.

### Country Garden Tour #2

Bill Stephens' family gardens sit on 8 acres of secluded woods that include a gazebo overlooking a pond and bridge. Bill added a second pond, whimsical art, a formal garden and a rose garden.

Ruby Lee and Paul Zitterbart's garden began about 1996 and has evolved through themes of sun, shade, and seasonal interest. They added new bed dimensions for more than 300 varieties of hosta, plus fern, heuchera, astilbe, tricyrtis and native plants.



Avon Gardens sits on part of Karen Robbins' grandfather's original farm. There are 5 acres of display gardens, water features and a wedding/reception venue. Karen has hosted more than a dozen national tours, and her gardens were featured in Midwest Living magazine.

### Plainfield Correctional Facility Training Garden Tour #3

Hendricks County Master Gardeners partner with the Plainfield Correctional Facility to provide horticulture training programs for offenders. These programs include an on-site garden, a greenhouse, and a culinary kitchen. Find out about the training and visit the garden for a close-up view of the project. To be admitted to the site, participants must complete a background check.



### Papercrete Potter Workshop — Part 1

The Papercrete Potter — each student creates a pot to take home. In addition, students walk away with a mold, printed instructions, safety tips, and a large bag.
